Considering initiation rites among the Tiyyar of South India, the Navajo, the Tiv of West Africa, and the Tukuna of the Northwest Amazon, Lincoln argues that unlike men’s rites, women’s rites do not impart a change in hierarchical status, but rather a “cosmic” change which offers religious compensation for women’s generally low socio-political status.

At the beginning of the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln and his highest-ranking general, George B. McClellan, agreed that the United States must preserve the Union. Their differing strategies for accomplishing that goal, however, created constant conflict. In Lincoln and McClellan at War, Chester G. Hearn explores this troubled relationship, revealing its complexity and showing clearly why the two men -- both inexperienced with war -- eventually parted ways. A staunch Democrat who never lost his acrimony toward Republicans -- including the president -- McClellan first observed Lincoln as an attorney representing the Illinois Central Railroad and immediately disliked him. This underlying bias followed thirty-five-year-old McClellan into his role as general-in-chief of the Union army. Lincoln, a man without military training, promoted McClellan on the advice of cabinet members and counted on "Little Mac" to whip the army into shape and end the war quickly. McClellan comported himself with great confidence and won Lincoln's faith by brilliantly organizing the Army of the Potomac. Later, however, he lost Lincoln's trust by refusing to send what he called "the best army on the planet" into battle. The more frustrated Lincoln grew with McClellan's inaction, the more Lincoln studied authoritative works on military strategy and offered strategic combat advice to the general. McClellan resented the president's suggestions and habitually deflected them. Ultimately, Lincoln removed McClellan for what the president termed "the slows." According to Hearn, McClellan's intransigence stemmed largely from his reluctance to fight offensively. Thoroughly schooled in European defensive tactics, McClellan preferred that approach to fighting the war. His commander-in-chief, on the other hand, had a preference for using offensive tactics. This compelling study of two important and diverse figures reveals how personality and politics prolonged the Civil War.

Set in the late 1970’s, A Lincoln Love Story is the semi-biographical account of Black student’s freshmen year at the first historically Black university, Lincoln University in Oxford, Pennsylvania. The story reaches into the past, when Lincoln was known as the "Black Princeton" and nurtured giants of the American experience like classmates Thurgood Marshall `29 ¿ and Langston Hughes `29 ¿. The story introduces traditional practices which all Lincoln freshmen experienced at the hands the upperclassmen in the early 20th century. Other parts of the practices are introduced through the fictional ¿ Bring Back the Traditions, Freshmen Rules ¿ , where Myron and his classmates of the Class of `81 ¿ are segregated from the upperclassmen until Homecoming and the ¿ Jump the Line ¿ ceremony. Seeking to allow freshmen to acclimate to the social and academic rigors of college and to build class unity, the ¿ Rules ¿ required freshmen to endure a freshmen code of conduct, freshmen beanies, initiation into the Order of Phi Classes, spontaneous public speaking, Wood Night, etc. and general harassment at the hands of the Zeus, the sophomores and the other upperclassmen. Providing an insight into the Black college experience, the reader is introduced to Lincoln of the late `70 ¿ s. Dormitory parties, panty raids, singing the ¿ Shoo Bob ¿ at basketball games, student protests and chapel talent shows are all true life events experienced by Myron and his classmates. Rabbling, a long standing tradition dominates the story, as the reader is introduced to a unique Lincoln art form. An art form practiced by Thurgood, Langston and Tolson and passed on to Myron and his classmates. Others sometimes see it as arrogance, but rabbling builds confidence and forms the basis of the legacy of excellence that is Lincoln University. Isolated and situated in the Chester County countryside, Myron and his classmates were forced to build a culture of success. A culture where they matured, worked and played hard, learned to depend on one another and fell in love with everything Lincoln.

In 1885, when former commander of the Army of the Potomac George Brinton McClellan published a criticism of the Lincoln administration's interference with McClellan's prosecution of the American Civil War, former U.S. Representative William Kelley was incensed. In this long-forgotten book, Kelley takes McClellan to task in detail. Considered one of the most honest and hard-working members of Congress during the Civil War, Kelley used official war documents, statements from surviving participants, and his own memory of his time as a founder of the Republican party and friend of Abraham Lincoln to make his compelling case. Ulysses S. Grant stated after his presidency, "McClellan is to me one of the mysteries of the war." Yet Grant had sympathy for what McClellan's burdens were early in the war. He remains so today. Brilliant, vain, and insubordinate, his stature was forever tarnished by his early mistakes and failures to strike decisive blows.
